- Children bring in any coins and notes from other countries that they have travelled to. They explain what the coin or note could purchase in the other country. Children bring in any coins and notes from other countries that have cultural significance to them. They describe the coins and notes, explaining the cultural significance of the pictures on each coin and note. Children compare coins and notes from other countries to Australian coins and notes. They match up coins and notes with the same values. They identify values of coins and notes that do not match.
